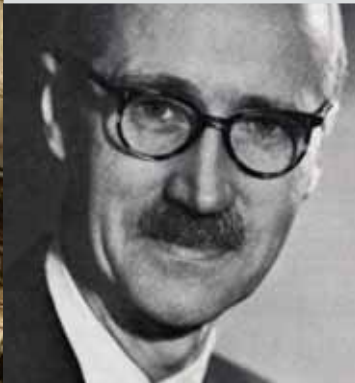

‘The Future of Finance After the Crisis’

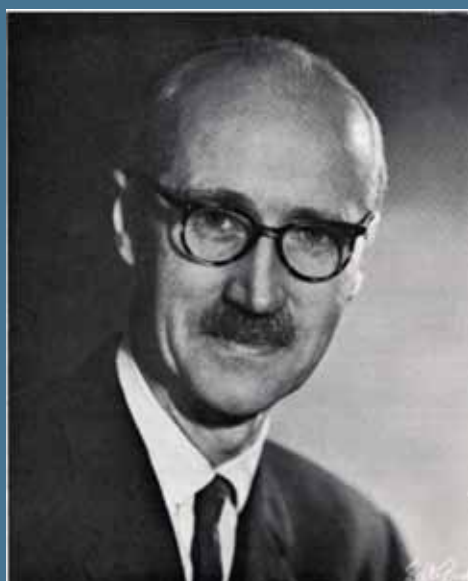

David Vines is Professor of Economics, and a Fellow of Balliol College, at the University of Oxford. He is also Adjunct Professor of Economics in the Centre for Applied Macroeconomic Analysis at the Australian National University, and a Research Fellow of the Centre for Economic Policy Research. His research interests include macroeconomics and international economics.

David obtained a BA in Economics and Mathematics from Melbourne University, and an MA and PhD in Economics from Cambridge University. He formerly held positions at Cambridge and also at Glasgow, where he was the Adam Smith Professor of Political Economy. He was the Director of the ESRC Research Programme on Global Economic Institutions in the UK and has also been a Director of Channel Four Television. More recently he has been a Director of Oxford Policy Management and of the Oxford Policy Institute.
