Conference on 'Monetary policy before, during and after the crisis'

This conference will be held at Heriot-Watt University, Edinburgh on Friday 30 September 2011. It aims to bring together a group of academic and central bank economists to review the issues around monetary policy before (did it contribute to the crisis, if so how?), during (how and how well have the various measures of 'unconventional monetary policy' worked?) and after (how has the experience of the crisis changed the environment for monetary policy in the future? what lessons should be learned?) the crisis, and to produce a set of papers which will be a key reference on the topic for future researchers. The conference is sponsored by the Scottish Institute for Research in Economics (SIRE), the Money, Macro & Finance Research Group (MMF) and Oxford Economic Papers, who have agreed to consider publishing a selection of the best papers as a special issue or symposium.
